Notes:

- The BS PSYC provides only 22 hours of upper division credit. Students will need to work with their advisor to plan for the additional 17 upper division hours needed to reach 39.
  - Students are strongly encouraged to consider a minor or certificate program.
  - Most pre-health pathways will not provide the 17 additional upper division hours.
- STAT 2000 is the best selection for AREA III as it is also required for Area VI.
- Please take note on the schedule above that 4 science courses are required for the Psychology degree and three of them have to include a lab.
- The Physical Sciences (1 w/out lab, 1 w/ lab) required in Area VI and Major will also fulfill Area II and the Franklin Physical Science requirement.
- Research is academically challenging and lab spaces are limited. Therefore, it is ideal for students with a specific goal of applying to either graduate or professional programs. Undergraduate research is not a Psychology degree program requirement, and we cannot accommodate all requests for research assistant positions.
- PSYC A Group=Biological Science focused courses.
- PSYC B Group=Social Psychology focused courses.
- For Major related elective (CSCI/MATH), MATH 1060 or CSCI 1100-1100L are recommended.
